«partly automated processing»


Article 2 GDPR

The distinction between manually or automatedly processed data or data to be processed cannot always be sharply made. Parliamentary Documents II 97/98, 25892, 23 a. 69








«non-automated processing»




systematic accessibility

This may concern a systematic composition of the files in accordance with a fixed structure that facilitates the access to the contents of the files or for the use of an automated index to make these files accessible. [..] Files for which such measues have not been taken are [..] not governed by the Dutch DP Act.

This is not altered by the fact that the files are filed in accordance with one single criterion, for example alphabetically or on the date of receipt *Parliamentary Documents II* 1998/99, 25892, no. 9, p. 2
